## Description

Wonderful English 19th century Fall landscape, with a figure on a pathway passing some Elm or Oak trees. This piece is signed lower right and is framed in a Vintage American Gold Leaf frame.

The painting went through Christie's, London in 2009 (see label on the reverse of the painting).

Percy was a landscape painter. Although he was a member of the Williams family (Boddington, Gilbert, and Adams), he used the name Percy to distinguish himself from them. He exhibited at the Royal Academy from 1842–1886, at the British Institution, and the Royal Society of British Artists. He painted in Devon, Yorkshire, the Lake District, and Skye, but mostly in Northern Wales. His studio sale was held at Christie's on November 27, 1886.
